Inspiration means that God influenced the writers of Scripture so that, even while writing according to their own styles, personalities, and experiences, the end result was that God's Word was written - authoritative, trustworthy, and free from error in the original manuscripts.

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2 Peter 1: 20 Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. 21 For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.
