DESTRUCTIVE ANGER WILL ...

- ... <u>Emerge</u> from different places in our backstage (Jas. 3.11).
 - -What is fueling this anger?
 - -What is the purpose of your anger?
 - -What are the consequences of your anger?



DESTRUCTIVE ANGER WILL ...

- ... Emerge from different places in our backstage (Jas. 3.11).
- ... <u>Control</u> another person in inappropriate, disrespectful, and condescending ways.
- ... Manipulate a person to meet my desires and expectations in inappropriate, disrespectful, and condescending ways.



DESTRUCTIVE ANGER WILL ...

• ... <u>Punish</u> a person who doesn't meet one's demands, desires, or expectations.



Ephesians 4:26-27
