


Ephesians 1:15-17 (NIV)

¹⁵ For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus AND your love for ALL the saints, 16 I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. ¹⁷ I KEEP ASKING that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, SO THAT you may KNOW Him BETTER.

Ephesians 1:18 (NIV)

¹⁸ I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may KNOW THE HOPE to which he has CALLED you,



 Knowing the hope to which He has called us is a work of the Spirit.

1 Corinthians 2:9-10

It is written: "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has PREPARED for those who love him"—¹⁰ but God has revealed it to us by his Spirit.

- Knowing the hope to which He has called us is a work of the Spirit.
- Knowing the hope to which He has called us gives us the resilience to endure hardship and disappointment.

1 Thessalonians 1:3

We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labor prompted by love, and your endurance INSPIRED BY HOPE in our Lord Jesus Christ.

- Knowing the hope to which He has called us is a work of the Spirit.
- Knowing the hope to which He has called us gives us the resilience to endure hardship and disappointment.
- Knowing the hope to which He has called us motivates us to trust our Father AND embrace the future *He has ordained* for us (Mark 8:34-37; 1 Peter 1:3-4).

 Knowing the hope to which He has called us is inspired by hearing the stories of hopefulness in the community. (Hebrews 11-12:3)
