



Jesus heals on the Sabbath

- Jesus healed on the Sabbath, and allowed other "sabbath violations"
- The Jewish leaders were indignant that Jesus told the man to carry his mat.
- Jesus was calling out the conflict between their adherence to religious rules instead of seeing His signs and wonders worked out before them.




