2023 Pastor's Annual Report

"How priceless Your faithful love is, God! People take refuge in the shadow of Your wings. They are filled from the abundance of Your house. You let them drink from Your refreshing stream. For the wellspring of life is with You. By means of Your light, we see light." (Psalm 36:7-9)

2023 was fulfilling year, only my second full year as Elim's lead pastor. I continue to be grateful that God has knit us together in gospel partnership. Our love for you is genuine. Brianna, the kids, and I deeply enjoy to being part of this spiritual family and it is my honor to serve this congregation as one of Christ's shepherds.

We began 2023 with three words for the new year: REST, REENGAGE, and RECONCILE. We committed together to rest in God's love, provision, and working; to reengage with the tasks and callings of the Christian life within Christian community; and to reconcile with one another when past hurts and new conflicts inevitably rear their ugly heads. I believe we succeeded. It was a full year, but not an activist one. We ministered to one another and to our community from a place of refreshment, confident that God's Spirit was working His will and way through His church.

It was also a year rich with kindness and goodness. There are so many flashbulb memories: Linda Smarr leading us back into intimate connection with one another through F.E.A.S.T. (Friends Eating and Sharing Together), the Sunday where we welcomed a class of ten individuals into covenant membership, Jenn Severns helping us experiment with how we might convert our Oasis House into an emergency cold weather shelter on snowy nights, the commissioning of Timothy Chase into his overseas YWAM mission, Samantha Kasper and our youth leaders hosting an eye-opening Passover seder for students, the incredible transformation of our sanctuary into a mountain railway station for VBS, and the creative and sacrificial service of Pat Davidson, Shauna Essman, Bill Parsons, and a team of faithful men who began to transform our dream of our new playground area into reality.

On the teaching front, we spent much of the year in the Gospel of Luke, where we wrestled with Jesus' example, learning from Him directly our way, truth, and life. From there, we feasted in the Old Testament book of Ruth, marveling at God's *hesed*, a Hebrew word that speaks to God's extraordinary loyalty and gracious devotion to those He calls His own. We ended the year exploring the various doors in the life of faith, a unique and memorable journey of discovery.

In retrospect, 2023 was a year in which we rekindled our relationships with Christ's international church and our participation in the Lord's global mission. We kicked off the year with a Giveaway Sunday, raising over \$10,000 for the ministries of the Hispanic and Marshallese congregations that weekly share our building. In May, we welcomed dear friends from Iran's underground church who shared with us miraculous stories of God's love and power and gave witness to the radical faithfulness and joyful witness of everyday believers in that closed Muslim country. In June, we celebrated our own Claire Kranik's reports from her medical mission in the West African nation of Togo. In September, we

cherished a visit from our long-time Congolese ministry partner and spiritual brother, Pastor Nubako Selenga. Finally, our Manger Offering on Christmas Eve raised over \$5,000 for missions projects in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Mexico. May God continue to bless and bring forth fruit from Elim's God-mirroring generosity!

2023 Elders Report

With the 2022 elder board feeling a bit lean (Ryan, Jeff, Gregg, Dan, Lars) and with Dan Amos having reached the end of his six-year elder term, for 2023 we welcomed two first-time elders, Willie Houze and Josh White, and one returning elder, Bill Parsons, back onto the shepherding team. It was great that these men answered the call to serve as part of the leadership of Elim.

2023 was sort of an apprentice year for me as elder chair, in partnership with vice chair Jeff Foerster. I appreciate the leadership that Jeff showed in helping me learn the chairman role and giving me insight in several difficult situations. Thank you, Jeff, for your encouragement, gentle prodding invitations, words of wisdom, and willingness to teach me.

In 2023, the elder board performed Ryan's first annual review and modernized the pastoral review process. Jeff helped me to set the guiding principles of the review, and we discerned what was important to evaluate in a pastoral review. We settled on a set of questions and a scope of who would be requested to provide feedback about Pastor Ryan. After gathering and compiling the feedback, I was happy to deliver a very positive review to our lead pastor, Ryan White.

The elder board made changes to how policy is established, revised, or modified by the Elim elder board. The elder board used these policy changes to update the Kids' Ministry and Student Ministry Volunteer Workers Policy. We took input from the Kids' Ministry Director and discussed the changes extensively. Changes included clarifying wording and changing policies to make children safer and making reporting requirements clearer so we are better equipped to protect children and workers.

In December, we updated one part of the Elim Statement of Faith to match the Statement of Faith that the EFCA voted to update in 2019. The elders had previously voted to approve this change some years ago, so bringing this change to a vote of the Elim congregation brought this decision full-circle.

2023 Kids' Ministry Report

In Elim's Kids' Ministry, the one thing that we want to make sure the kids are learning is that the Lord loves and cares for his children. We give our lives to him in full confidence, knowing that he is wise, powerful, and loving. He is worthy of our praise and our trust! We have been spending the year finding out exactly why he is worthy, and examples of the right way to respond.

In the Lilies, which is what we call the nursery, the little ones have been consistently reading and singing about the fruits of the Spirit. They are learning that church is a friendly, fun, and wonderful place to be, and the seeds of God's truth are being planted in their hearts.

The Lights (pre-k through 2nd grade) started out the year reading through Exodus. We took our time, and learned all about how God, through the obedience of his friend and servant Moses, led his sheep to freedom. The kids learned what the tabernacle and all its parts were like, and how God took such great care in giving perfect instructions to his children. We also celebrated Sukkot and talked about why it's important to trust God by keeping his commands of remembrance.

The Garden (3rd through 6th grade) methodically worked through the Torchlighters curriculum, learning each month about a different "hero of the faith." It's very important for kids to see people living lives of what we might call radical faith, and to begin to understand that the more completely we give our life to Christ, the more power he has for good in us and through us.

We had an excellent VBS in July, as well as our second annual Hootenanny in October. Both were not only fun but also opened our doors to guests from the community. The kids performed a couple of different songs throughout the year, and we continued our practice of kids' moments once per month with the congregation.

One other wonderful thing that is happening is that through God's grace, our new playground is almost finished! The whole process is an outstanding testament to the Lord's provision, as we looked to him for help and guidance, and he gave everything we needed. I am talking about ideas, money, able and willing helpers, the right weather conditions... the list could go on and on. At every step we prayed, and as we trusted the Lord, the way opened. We are so thankful for everyone who has made it possible. Praise God!

2023 Student Ministries Report

2023 Discipleship Ministry Report

We have continued to have a diverse and significant number of discipleship group offerings for interested participants. We currently have three women's groups, two men's groups, and five co-ed groups. One of those groups is focused on recovery. With our 10 groups available, it's nice to have constellation diversity along with various days and meeting times to help accommodate busy schedules. Some groups have seen an increase in the number of group participants this past year, particularly witnessed within the men's groups!

To assist with group awareness to encourage new member participation, we continued in 2023 providing individual group snippets called In-Focus Offerings placed in the Elim newsletter. Discipleship group information has been shared at new member classes.

After the service on September 10, a discipleship group connection event was held. Tables with information about each group were manned by group leaders or their designees along with providing signup sheets. This PR event was held to let people know about the groups and have a chance to sign. Some new members did join groups through this outreach event.

Group leaders held bi-monthly meetings. During these meetings we discuss articles which are shared about twice a month with all kinds of information and suggestions regarding small groups. We also discuss future plans and ideas for our discipleship groups to keep them vibrant moving forward. A favorite discussion is how the particular studies groups are embarking on is going.

A strong focus for the coming year will be the developing of group apprentices, with the hope to eventually become group leaders so more groups can be developed, along with assisting in the leadership of current groups while apprenticing occurs.

Leaders thought it might be a good idea to ascertain how many people were currently participating in discipleship groups, so, group leaders shared how many participants were involved in their groups. This information was shared with group leaders and church elders. We were pleased to find that a total of 77 Elim attendees are involved in groups. But the good news is, there's room for more!

Our discipleship groups hope to continue to be a strong ministry and service not only for the people of Elim, but also as a tool for outreach within the community.

Our goals for 2024:

- Continue training and coordinating the efforts of security greeters to help keep Elim and its children safe.
- Repeat and refine Elim 101 / 201 / 301 classes at least once or as often as needed, as we seek to welcome newcomers and new members and equip Elimites for more effective ministry to our congregation and community.

In addition to our 13 volunteer greeters and security specialists, special thanks goes to my partner in ministry, Dr. Dave Lingenfelter, who gave great assistance in particular with the 301 classes; and also to our staff and elders, as well as Deacon of Discipleship Groups Julie Brannon, who rendered wonderful assistance in pulling off the 101 and 201 classes.

2023 Ministry to Women Annual Report

2023 was a year filled with new beginnings and growth for MtoW and we thank the Lord for this!

We held our first "Parents Night Out" in February, the fund we raised for that event went to our benevolence fund at Elim. It was such a success we will continue to host this event in 2024.

Throughout the summer months we held *Simple Evening - Women's Gatherings* where once a month we gathered at a home and played yard games, shared a time of prayer, worship and short devotional. We hope to be able to continue in 2024.

Julie Brannon launched our *Cultivate! Women's Workshops*. These quarterly workshops deal with a host of topics from the practical such as women's health to the spiritual growth in God's word.

In the fall Becky Vanderhoff, Becca Finch and Linda Busic help launch MtoW's first post-pandemic outreach ministry called Embrace Grace. This program is geared for pregnant single mothers in need of community and the gospel. From EmbraceGrace.com, "When you join this support group, you will: meet weekly for 12 weeks, be encouraged by women who have walked in your shoes, make new friends, and receive a baby shower in your honor." Our Embrace Grace team went through the 12-week program, and with the blessed help of many volunteers provided meals, childcare, and an amazing baby shower. It was a blessing to see God provide for their ministry. We are hopeful that the seeds planted for the young mothers involved in Embrace Grace to seek and know Lord and thrive as mothers.

During the Advent season we partnered with Linda Smarr to host an "Elim Family Meal". Many families gathered and enjoyed games, carols, delicious soups and desserts. We also created gift bags for Care Net, with assistance from Fran Amos.

We provided over a dozen Meal Trains this year, as an effective way to show practical application to being the hands and feet of Jeus to those at Elim. Janine Lawrence along with Lori Cantu organize these.

Julie Brannon continues to be our ministry lead over our women's discipleship groups. They continue to flourish.

We continued with attending the Women's Retreat at Black Lake Bible Camp in October, and we held both a Bunco and game night in the spring.

This summer Shauna Essman stepped down from our team. We are so thankful for her involvement over the last several years. Shauna faithfully persevered and led our team during the covid pandemic. She found creative and God honoring ways of maintaining our ministry. The Lord blessed her efforts and during that time God grew our ministry to what it is today.

2023 Financial Report

As Treasurer and a member of the Elim Stewardship Team, we give thanks to God for your continued faithful giving in 2023. Through His never-ending grace we started and ended the year strong and again were able to meet all our financial obligations, including all local and international ministries, and several capital improvements to include starting the working on replacing the worn-out playground equipment!

For 2023, Elim's members approved an operating budget of \$325,838, and giving was \$566 over budget! We also saw an overall increase in giving to the Benevolence Fund and ended the year with a total giving of \$3,414. We met our commitment to Denominational Support for the EFCA as well as provided support to our Holistic Outreach Ministries at home and around the globe.

Unfortunately, we did not have all of the financial worksheets available at the time of this report so we are unable to provide those pages, but they can be made available at a later date.
