

"Without revelation, people run wild, but one who follows divine instruction will be happy." (Proverbs 29:18; CSB)


"Where there is no prophetic vision, the people cast off restraint..." (Proverbs 29:18; ESV)

In the life and calling God has for us, VISION is necessary for perseverance, for it buoys hope, strengthens our trust in God, and enables us to endure in obedience.

Hazón is an exhilarating vision, a transportive dream, a vivid & often highly visual revelation from God, that allows you to see beyond how things ARE to how they one day COULD/WILL be.





Vision <u>GIVES LIFE</u> and vision <u>CONSTRAINS</u>.



In our Christian walk, God <u>GRACES</u> us with vision, but often denies us <u>SIGHT</u>.

"We walk by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7)

"We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters... so that you will not grieve like the rest, who have no hope." (1 Thessalonians 4:13)

Instead of contemplating the apocalyptic we should be gazing at the POST-APOCALYPTIC—the life, redemption, and renewal that comes after difficulty.

"I will give peace to the land, and you will lie down with nothing to frighten you." (Leviticus 26:6)


"Though all the peoples walk in the name of their own gods, we will walk in the name of the LORD our God forever and ever." (Micah 4:5)


Micah reminds us that vision does not necessarily mean possessing a SECRET KNOWLEDGE of future events.
